STORM DRAIN SYSTEM PERMITS

The State of Hawaii, Department of Transportation Highways Division Maui District currently administers a permitting program for any individual, business, or agency that wishes to establish a temporary or permanent physical connection to and/or discharge storm water runoff into the Maui District storm drain system (MS4). Permittees have a direct effect on the quality of waters discharged to the State storm drainage system, so we appreciate your cooperation in filling out the permit application and working with us to keep our storm drains, and ultimately our ocean clean.

What's the difference between a Connection Permit and a Discharge Permit?

A **Discharge Permit** is a temporary permit to discharge stormwater during construction.



A **Connection Permit** is required when a permanent connection to the State storm drain system is proposed.



Requests for a connection or discharge permit can be submitted using an *Application for a Private Storm Drain Connection and/or Discharge Permit to the State of Hawaii Highways Division Storm Drain System*. Completed forms should be submitted at the Maui District office front desk located at:

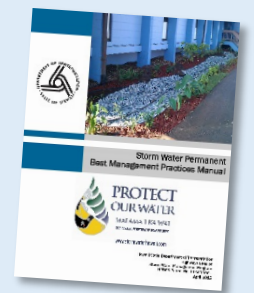
Along with your
DISCHARGE PERMIT
you may need

- **NPDES Permit for Discharges of Storm Water Associated with Construction Activities.** NPDES permit coverage is required for activities that disturb one (1) acre or more of total land area. NPDES permit coverage is also required for activities that disturb less than one (1) acre of total land area that are part of a larger common plan of development or sale if the larger common plan will ultimately disturb one (1) acre or more of total land area.
- **NPDES Permit for Discharges of Construction Activity Dewatering.** NPDES permit coverage is required for discharges to State waters of construction activity dewatering effluent. “Dewatering Effluent” is any type of water (e.g. ground water, storm water, stream water, ocean water, etc.) pumped from a construction area.
- **NPDES Permit for Discharges of Hydrotesting Waters.** NPDES permit coverage is required for the release or discharge of hydrotesting waters to State waters. “Hydrotesting Waters” means water used to test the integrity of a tank or pipeline, pipeline disinfection, and/or pipeline flushing.

Along with your
CONNECTION PERMIT
you may need

- To include **Permanent Best Management Practices** on your project. New development or redevelopment projects that disturb an area of one acre or more of land are required to be reviewed for storm water controls. Smaller projects, less than one acre, that have the potential to discharge pollutants into our storm drains may also be required to install specific permanent BMPs.

If permanent BMPs are not included, submit specific documentation demonstrating that they are not practical.
